The mission of Anchor Bible Church is to love God, love people, and make disciples of Jesus Christ.

The Body of Christ

One of John Wesley's favorite passages relating to the nature of the church comes in Ephesians 4:7-16. The vast wealth apparent in the city of Ephesus cannot be overstated. Archaeology shows that the streets of Ephesus were lined with beautifully ornate buildings, sculptures, and social gathering areas such as amphitheaters and bathhouses. As a highly populated port-city, Ephesus was a vibrant Roman metropolis that provided residents and visitors with many of life's joys. Because of this, the pursuit of pleasure had become more important than anything in life, including treatment of others.

Ephesians 4:7-16 focuses on the unity of the body of believers necessary in order to achieve Christlikeness. Paul then goes on to list out a number of different leaders who are tasked with helping the believers, referred to as "the body" grow into unity and Christ-likeness (4:10-16). Interestingly, there are two anatomical metaphors being used in these verses. The first metaphor uses the process of maturing as a picture for the growth of the collective believers so that they may attain "the fullness of Christ" (4:12-14). The mature or grown personhood that is achieved by unity in the body of Christ is contrasted to the immaturity of a child. Children are said to be easily tossed around by the waves, an appropriate picture for a port city, that represent human deceit. The second metaphor portrays communal growth in opposition to false teaching as a body that is properly connected at its joints and "grows into him who is the head" (4:15-16). Both of these pictures use human growth as a metaphor for the growth Paul desires to see in the body of Christ. Love, unity, and resiliency are all things that he claims can be used to reach the apparent goal of growing to be more like Christ. The opposite of the spiritual maturity on display in verse thirteen is paralleled in fourteen by the depiction of children as unable to withstand the pressures of false teaching. The implication is that not only do unity and knowledge lead to a maturity that is necessary for the spiritual growth of the body and its members, but that a lack of these things will be detrimental to the body's health in the face of cultural pressure.

The language Paul uses to describe the false teachers is not light-hearted, and holds similarities to his treatment of false teaching in his other writings. These false teachers are portrayed not as those who are themselves uneducated or misspeak accidentally, but as those who deliberately and deceitfully attempt to lead God's people astray for demonic purposes. Children, or those who have not grown in the unity of faith and the knowledge of the Son of God, are easily deceived by the cunningness of these false teachers. On the contrary, maturity in knowledge and unity gives strength to weather the storms of these deceivers and to stay the course for the callings presented in verse twelve. Unity and knowledge together are important for growing into the fullness of Christ. It is crucial for believers to recognize that this passage holds significance not only for first century Christians, but for the Christians of today as well. In Acts 20, Paul can be seen speaking directly to the leaders in Ephesus about how false teachers, deceivers, will come upon them (Acts 20:29-30). False teachers will exist until the day of Christ's return, and Paul's words hold as much importance for the modern reader as they did for the Ephesians.

In the midst of all the forces that seek to pull us every which way in modern life, unity and maturity in the body of Christ are as important as ever, and this fall we will spend time focusing on the ways that God has called us to live into our role as the Body of Christ.


