"Preparation"

Have you ever wondered what Lent was all about and why we observe it? For many of us today, we hear Christians in various areas giving something up or in some cases, adding a Christian practice to their lives.

The history of Lent dates back to the council of Nicea 325 AD. This was a council of Bishops who came together to combat many early church heresies. One in particular was the Arian belief that Jesus was inferior to God. The Nicea Council brought forth the truth of the Word of God that God is present as the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The ultimate outcome was the Nicean Creed that is very much alive today.

From the Nicaea Council combating early falsehoods in the Church much more than the Nicean Creed was a result. One particular practice of the Christian life came to be what we know as "Lent."

Lent represents the 40 days of temptation Jesus endured in the desert by Satan. This 40 day period begins on Ash Wednesday (not counting the 6 Sundays in the duration). The early forms of Lent had a heavy consistency of fasting from meat, fish, and dairy. The fasting would be one small meal a day after 3:00pm. In some areas it was fasting on Wednesday and Friday.

Once the Protestant Revolution hit the ground running, many of the Lenten practices were brought into question. The main argument was Jesus didn't give us specific timeframes of fasting or from what we should fast. Therein lies where we have come today as Protestants.

The Lord, time and time again, focuses on the condition of our hearts. Matthew 6:16-18 is a specific place we hear Jesus addressing fasting; "16 "When you fast, do not look somber as the hypocrites do, for they disfigure their faces to show others they are fasting. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward in full. 17 But when you fast, put oil on your head and wash your face, 18 so that it will not be obvious to others that you are fasting, but only to your Father, who is unseen; and your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you."

From the Isrealites and early Christians traditions and modes of focusing their lives upon God, we find ourselves in our present day. So what does Lent mean to us now? As time has grown we observe Lent as a time to refocus our lives and hearts upon the Lord.

Many Protestants use Lent as a time of preparation for new believers to be baptized while others creatively use this time to remove something from their lives that distracts them or hinders their faith.

What we believe here at Anchor Bible Church about Lent is this is a time period for us to confess both to our neighbor and God. To make mends and offer forgiveness while receiving it at the same time. We believe this is a time to repent from sin. We believe this is a time to rekindle the flame of our faith as we await Jesus' death and resurrection.

The hope is that we set our hearts and eyes upon the anchor of our souls, our Savior Jesus Christ. Not just in these 40 days, but for the rest of our lives. May each of us be prompted by the Holy Spirit to live into our faith deeper each and every day.

Thank you, Lord, for blessing us.




Huge Praises!!!
